When it comes to high-end travel private jets are so passé, with elite crowds opting for luxury on water aboard five-star yachts. Only recently movie titan Steven Spielberg paid US\$200 million (Dhs734 m) for his super vessel, Seven Seas, while the launch of History Supreme, a gold-plated craft that scooped the title of World's Most Expensive Yacht (Dhs8.5 billion), proves that when it comes to sailing its decadence all the way. The new fad may be expensive but by offering more privacy than plush city hotels and broadening your horizons destinationwise, it's rapidly becoming the only way to holiday among celebrities and millionaires alike. SPENDIT reveals some of the best yacht charters...

THE BASICS Prices for high end charters start at around Dhs2,907 a week. This price usually covers captain, crew and insurance, but may not include fuel, docking and water charges, which will add approximately 25-30 per cent to the bill.

Not every superyacht will have a statue like the History Supreme's, which is made from the bone of Tyrannosaurus Rex, but a swimming pool and helicopter pad are certainly expected, according to Jill Bobrow, author of the book *Outrageous Yachts*. Bobrow states that elaborate spas with steam rooms and beauty salon spaces are also becoming standard, whilst other soon-to-be-must-haves include personal submarines, DJ consoles and waterfalls.

SOLEMATES

What is it? American music producer Sean 'P Diddy' Combs made waves recently when he spent a week with his family on board this high-tech ship.

Why charter it? A blend of intelligent design and edgy flair, the major innovation on this yacht is the groundbreaking technology that allows guests to choose their morning newspaper, order dinner, close the blinds in their cabin, or turn on the TV just by pressing a button on their iPad control system. And with new charter destinations for 2012 including the Pacific coast and Costa Rica, Solemates promises "the ultimate charter experience".

The amenities: Five light-filled, spacious guest cabins have kingsize beds and en suite bathrooms. The wood-panelled Owner's Suite on the main deck boasts panoramic views. Toys include a couple of Watershed SeaBobs, golf clubs and biodegradable balls, and state-of-the-art powered surfboards.

What is it? Originally built in 1943 as a Canadian convoy escort, this legendary superyacht was bought and refurbished by Aristotle Onassis in the mid 1950s.

Why charter it? Apart from the kudos of cruising in a vessel that has hosted A-listers including Maria Callas, Frank Sinatra, John F Kennedy and Sir Winston Churchill, the Christina O has every possible amenity to make you enjoy life on the ocean waves as much as Onassis and his guests did back in the swinging sixties.

The amenities: • Elegantly designed it has 17 magnificently appointed guest staterooms as well as the lavish, and legendary, Onassis Suite complete with a Jacuzzi bathroom, and private lounge. • Other luxury touches include a large Jacuzzi deck with canopied sunbathing areas, a massage and beauty salon, a fully equipped gymnasium and a saltwater swimming pool that converts to dance floor as soon as the sun sets. • Big toys include waveriders, waterskis and snorkelling gear, giving you plenty of options for creating fun.
